

CACS board members, bond proposal, township races decided in Flint Twp.

FLINT TWP. — Area residents headed to the polls Nov. 5 deciding races for the Flint Township supervisor, clerk, treasurer and members for the Board of Trustees. They also decided races for the Carman-Ainsworth Community School board members and the school's bond.

Flint Township Board of Trustees

Karyn Miller, the incumbent Democratic candidate for supervisor received 11,545 votes. There were also 294 write-in votes.

Manya Triplett, the incumbent Democratic township clerk candidate received 11,440 votes. There were also 280 write in votes.

Tom Klee, the incumbent Democratic township treasurer candidate received 11,474 votes. There were also 295 write-in votes.

Democratic candidates Tenesia Amadou, Gene Leverette Sr., Jenna McIntire and Barb Vert all secured spots on the Flint Township Board of Trustees. Amadou received 10,110 votes, Leverette Sr. received

10,104 votes, Jenna McIntire received 10,217 votes and Vert received 10,153 votes. There were also 538 write-in votes.

Carman-Ainsworth Board of Education

Incumbent board members Gary Cousins and Gloria Nealy retained their positions. Cousins received 7,323 votes and Nealy received 8,575 votes. There were also 170 write-in votes.

Newcomer Mary Margaret Gleason-Gidcumb secured a spot on the Carman-Ainsworth Community Schools Board. She will serve a partial term ending in December 2026. She received 9,524 votes. There were also 176 write-in votes.

Carman-Ainsworth Schools Bond Proposal

Voters approved the Carman-Ainsworth Community Schools Building and Site Bond proposal. There were 8,538 votes in favor and 4,428 votes opposing the bond. According to previous reporting, there was a zero-mill figured associated with the bond, and it's expected to provide \$65.2 million to fund projects that include enhancing

Voters decide county's top elected officials

GENESEE COUNTY — Voters decided races across Genesee County, including races for the county sheriff, clerk and register of deeds, prosecutor, drain commissioner and treasurer.

Genesee County Sheriff
Democratic incumbent candidate Christopher Swanson received the most votes in the race for Genesee County Sheriff with a total of 139,685. His opponent, Republican candidate Jeff Salzeider received 75,922 votes. There were also a total of 462 write-in votes in this race.

Genesee County Clerk/ Register of Deeds

Democratic incumbent candidate Domonique Clemons received the most votes in the race for Genesee County Clerk and Register of Deeds with a

total of 140,663. There were also 4,355 write-in votes.

Genesee County Treasurer
Democratic candidate Sam Muma received the most votes in the race for Genesee County Treasurer with a total of 138,215. There were also 4,259 write-in votes.

Genesee County Prosecutor
Prosecutor David Leyton was unopposed in his bid for re-election.

Genesee County Drain Commissioner

In the race for drain commissioner, Democrat Jeff Wright was leading U.S. Taxpayers Party candidate David Niggemeyer by a vote of 126,163-34,095.

All of the votes shown here are tentative numbers from Wednesday, Nov. 6. Final results are pending certification of the vote by the Genesee County Board of Canvassers.
